

educational and medical development, as well as his love for all of Taiwan's people. Yuhani thanked Canada for preserving part of Taiwan's aboriginal heritage, and praised Canadians for their international vision and conscience dating back to Mackay's era.

The importance of the event was evident in the huge turnout by Taiwan's news media --- television stations carried much of the event live, and nearly all the major newspapers, both Chinese and English, gave it considerable importance. The exhibit itself was mobbed, as several hundred visitors flowed through in the first hour.

**Onward**

The exhibit will run until September 30 and it is tentatively booked for the Kaohsiung Museum of Science for October 15-December 31. The ROM has indicated that it would like to arrange a Canadian showing after the items are returned to Toronto in 2002.

**Accounting**

The CTOT will incur total costs of \$7-9,000 from PIF spread over two FYs. This represents less than 5% of the total cost.
